VIII CRCNA UPDATE

Greetings Colorado Region!

As required by the Guidelines, included are the budgets for CRCNA 26. These budgets mostly follow what the actual expenses were for CRCNA 25 with a few exceptions:

- H&I is asking for 150 Basic Texts and 100 Introductory Guides.
- CRCNA 26 is requesting \$1,000 for literature to be sold at the Merchandise table. This has not always been the case, and CRCNA 26 believes you should be able to buy NA literature at an NA convention.
- The Administrative Committee is requesting an additional \$322 dollars. This is to pay for insurance.
- There is an additional \$125 indicated in P&D's budget in the "banner" line. This is because, as mentioned at the Assembly, we were not satisfied with the results of the first and had it redone.

Although not requested in this years' budget, I would like to bring a matter to the attention of the Region.

When a taper is invited to a convention, they pay all their travel costs, hotel costs, and equipment costs. Then they hope to make up these costs by selling CDs. In discussions with all the major tapers around the Country, it is getting more and more difficult for them to foot the entire bill to provide this service to conventions. People aren't buying as many CDs, and travel expenses are increasing. If we want to have our conventions recorded in the future, we need to either look at investing in what is required to do it ourselves (some Regions, such as Michigan, do this) or consider, at the least, providing a room for the taper on Friday and Saturday Night. I think we should discuss this matter.

Tapers, speakers, and workshop and marathon topics will be voted on at the June 9, 2012 CRCNA meeting, and I will have the topics to you for approval in July. The Vice Chair will presiding over the June CRCNA meeting, as I have a previous commitment related to the death of a close family member.

Please pass the word about our next event - the second annual "Addict Night Out" at the Lakeside Amusement Park on Friday, June 22. Gates and rides open at 4PM, and the admission is \$12. The BBQ starts at 5:30 and there is a speaker at 7:00. All this information is on our website.

Speaking of the website, online registration and hotel registration is now active.

 - All newcomers are not being treated equally—why are Basic Texts not given to every newcomer?
 Why are H&I people singled out?
 - H&I people cannot get out and have no money to purchase their own Basic Texts.
 - Budget for newcomers does not include literature.
 - Area H&I committees should provide Basic Texts at H&I facilities.
 - Intro Guides alone should be given to H&I attendees.
 - o Basic Texts could be given out in a different forum besides CRCNA to H&I peoples
 - Just ask newcomers (all newcomers) at convention with less than 6 months if they want a Basic Text and give them one.
 - o Every newcomer is not getting a Basic Text at the countdown.

Proposal to approve budget. Block to H&I budget for Basic Texts expenditure. Block failed by one vote.

Proposal to approve budget without H&I portion of budget. Concensus reached. H&I budget will be revised and represented at July CRSC.

To date Narcotics Anonymous is serving 7 DOC facilities including Arkansas Valley in Ordway, Camp George West in Golden, Delta Correctional Facility, Denver Women's Correctional Facility, LaVista Women's and San Carlos Men's both located in Pueblo, and Sterling Correctional Facility- East side and Westside meetings. Of all the hundreds of addicts we have in the Narcotics Anonymous fellowship across the state of Colorado, we only have 33 volunteers cleared to carry the NA message into the prisons. Another fact is that in Canon City- which is the

greatest population of prisons- we have NO NA meetings in those facilities! This is completely due to lack of volunteers. We also lost our two volunteers in the Sterling area and thank God there is a Christian couple who goes every week and allows the addicts to meet- as the addicts in Sterling have been running their own Narcotics Anonymous meeting there for years. This couple does nothing but sit on the side so the prisoners can actually have an NA meeting- DOC rules state that someone who is cleared must be present to allow any facility to have a meeting.

With that being said I would like to first of all thank the 33 addicts from the areas across Colorado who currently participate and bring in the Narcotics Anonymous message to the prisons. Next I would ask that any addict that can pass a background check- which is off paper for three years- to please fill out an application and start this much needed process. Dawn will have applications today and she will give you my phone number as I have to sign the application before it goes to the DOC corporate headquarters. It is against their policy to give out pre signed applications so we follow their process correctly. Once you are approved there is an 8 hour DOC training that you have to attend and a short facility training at the facility you will be volunteering at. Once this is completed you will be able to team up with the other volunteers and go into your chosen facility.

On a much lighter note there is so much that has been accomplished with DOC over the past several years. We now have a DOC liaison for Narcotics Anonymous and we have added 4 DOC prisons in the past 3 years. We now have a DOC basic training and the updated training that takes place at our Colorado Regional Convention of Narcotics Anonymous and CRCNA XXVI will be holding our 2nd annual training with DOC. We also have the honor of being able to have the addicts that attend the prison meetings with us live at CRCNA XXVI during the Sunday morning Spiritual Speaker. If you missed that event at CRCNA last year- you will not want to ever miss it again. It was an amazing experience to hear the addicts in the background as we introduce the individual facilities that are present to join with us during that speaker meeting. In that moment we are connected as addicts all there for the same purpose- to carry the message of Narcotics Anonymous. I believe our convention is the first Unite States convention to have accomplished this monumental event. This is done every year at the World Convention and I believe it is the most powerful highlight of the entire convention. So make your necessary arrangements to attend CRCNA this year it is going to be AWESOME!!!

The last item on my agenda is to talk about the Western States Learning Days that will be held in Denver the 2nd weekend in October. We are currently working with DOC to have them attend the PR workshops that will be held on Friday October 12, 2012. There will be more details to follow as we obtain more information.

I am honored to be apart of Regional H&I Subcommittee and am willing to help any addict obtain DOC clearance to further carry the NA message into the Colorado Department of Corrections facilities.

An open letter to the CRSCNA.

At the November 20, 2011 CRSC meeting, a discussion took place resulting in a motion being brought forward to remove the chair of WSLD 26, based on a violation of our concepts and traditions. Also included in the proposal was the chair's failure to fulfill the duties of the position as were directed by the CRSCNA. The intent of the motion read "to create unity within the Colorado Region and to have a successful WSLD.

Much discussion took place regarding specific topics and issues. The aforementioned can be found in section XVI page 16 of the November 20 minutes. The end result was that some attendees felt the proposal very extreme although it is noted that there are valid points and issues and there should be a way to develop and agree on a plan to address those concerns. I, as regional chair proposed, as noted in those minutes "to work closely with Mac to get things in place and move forward productively". The proposal to remove the WSLD chair was brought to consensus and rejected by stand-asides.

Unfortunately, in the past 2 months I have been either contacted directly or been aware of multiple issues regarding the continued violation by the WSLD chair of our concepts and traditions. As I made a commitment to you, to work closely with him, I feel I may have let you down and need to report that My efforts may have not been successful in that regard.

Regrettably, I would submit to you that violations of our 2nd, 5th and 12th concept to service have been repeatedly, seemingly disrespected. Furthermore, other issues have been brought to me which are not specific to WSLD but to PI and the PR umbrella. I have forwarded that information to the PR chair.

Now, the elephant in the room. I could not be any more uncomfortable speaking to the accountability of one of our elected trusted servants without them being in the present. I only learned of his absence with notice this past Wednesday. But after having spoken with several members of our server structure, both in and out of the Colorado region, I felt it a violation of our concepts to not bring this information forward today.

It's not my position to conduct an inquisition into this matter. Only to provide you with the information and let the CRSC body determine a course of action. Ultimately, his body is responsible for the success of the services we provide. Our misfortune is not found in admitting our need for help, but in our reluctance to be accountable. In closing, or 5th concept addresses responsibility and accountability. It says and I quote "Exercise of concept 5 is not to be taken lightly. It calls for us to carefully consider the service work we want done; to clearly designate who should do that work; to delegate the authority to do it; and to maintain accountability for those duties. It takes effort to consistently apply Concept 5, but the results are well worth the effort". In both cases, whether it be the chair of WSLD or the members of this body the same applies. We have been appointed by our membership to serve their interests at this body, and to be accountable for the actions of those whom we elect. That being said, it's my feeling we have no choice but to discuss this issue in the absence of the WSLD chair.
