Here is the January CNAC Report.

Since the last CRSC meeting, CNAC reached agreement and signed contracts for CRCNA 32 and 33 in 2018 and 2019 respectively. The contracts are with the Crowne Plaza Convention Center in Denver for the first weekend in November each year. The contracts each call for a \$3000 deposit due by 12/31/2017 for CRCNA 32, and 12/31/2018 for CRCNA 33.

CNAC currently has two items on our plate. First, we worked with the Women's Retreat Administrative Committee to finalize a contract for the 2017 Women's Retreat. One question raised by this process has to do with budgets and bookkeeping. About 10 years ago CRCNA adopted a standard line-item budget form and exclusively used Quickbooks. This is very helpful for CNAC when we pay taxes each year. The question then is, should the Women's Retreat and the Regional Campout also adhere to these standards. Based on what I'm seeing so far it seems reasonable that CNAC will need to include the campout and retreat in the 2017 tax year.

The second item has to do with 1212 Mariposa. We were approached by MHASC, which also meets here, because the Denver Inner City Parish had requested that MHASC sign a licensing agreement for use of the space. I met with the MHASC Chair and Vice Chair here, as well as with Larry Martinez, representing the DICP. It was a very good meeting. DICP expressed their need to just have everything in writing. The draft of the licensing agreement they provided was a rough draft. There are things that both sides need to amend in the agreement, and that process is ongoing. Once that is completed, a licensing agreement for CRSC use of this space will be drafted using the MHASC agreement as a model. What I need to know for purposes of drafting that agreement is, what do we pay DICP for use of this space, and how long do we sign for? MHASC is signing to the end of their fiscal year, June 30, at which time they will sign for another year.

A couple of concerns are raised by this. First, there is a possibility that DICP will lose use of this space by 2019. If that happens, CRSC might need to find another place to meet. The second concern is whether a negotiation like this fits into the scope of CNAC. Both the MHASC Chair and Vice Chair are uncomfortable having their signatures on this document. They support the document, but they are asking CNAC to sign. As CNAC is the "Colorado Narcotics Anonymous Convention" Corporation, it seems a bit out of our scope, however if it makes sense to the Region we serve, we are happy to handle this.
