  - 1 addict from Southern - workshop
  - 2 addict from Serenity Unlimited - workshopYet, 11 addicts for the workshop were from out of this region - couldn't we find Colorado addicts is to involved on our own convention? And, by the way, of the 11 "out-of-towners" several of them were formerly from PPASC..... Denver addicts felt if you wanted to hear from addicts not in Colorado - go to the NA world convention.....





## Boulder Area Report to CRSC November 11, 2001

Good Morning All,

The Boulder Area is alive and doing well. Since the last CRSC meeting, a new group has joined the Boulder Area. The new group meets in Brighton at 6 PM on Monday Evenings at 147 S 2<sup>nd</sup> Place (see attached flyer). The meeting is an open discussion meeting that allows smoking and is wheel chair accessible.

The Clean for Today Group of Longmont is planning a New Year's Eve Dance at 729 Main St in Longmont from 9:30 PM -?? (See attached flyer).

The Boulder Area is making a \$100 donation to the Colorado Region today.

We are also asking this body to approve a bid for CRCNA XVI to be held in Boulder. We have formed a committee to seek out hotels in the area that are willing and capable to host this annual event. The Chair off this committee is willing to serve as the chair of the CRCNA XVI Host and Hospitality Committee. Previous CRCNA Chairs and members of the fellowship with experience in the Hospitality Industry have graciously volunteered to assist with the contract negotiations. Attached you will find a letter of intent and the Hotel Fact Sheet of one of the three hotels we will be considering for the convention. We have already toured a second hotel and have a proposal from them, but they were unable to get a letter of intent and Hotel Fact Sheet prepared to be presented to this body this morning. The third hotel under consideration will be inspected before the first CRCNA XVI committee meeting and all three bids will be submitted to that body at that time.

Some historical considerations:

- ✓ The last CRCNA to be held in Boulder County was CRCNA II in 1988,
- ✓ The last time the Boulder Area actually sponsored a CRCNA was CRCNA VI in 1992 although this event was held in Estes Park,
- ✓ The CRCNA XIII committee was under this mistaken impression that Estes Park was in the Boulder Area in 1999, and believed that Boulder was the hosting Area when it was not. This objection was brought to and discussed by this body at that time.
- ✓ The Hospitality Industry in Boulder County has received excellent reference from previous hotels and is happy to provide us a site to hold our convention.
- ✓ Currently there is no guideline in place for a formal bid process, so I have been instructed by the BASC to bring this matter to this body for discussion and action.



Since the inception of this ad-hoc committee I have had two meetings. The first was held on October 15 and one addict showed up. I received a phone call from the Foothills Area Activities Chair and she informed me she was ill. The second meeting was held on October 28 and three people attended. The Foothills and Denver Area Activities Chairs both attended and another interested addict. The next meeting will be held Sunday November 18, 1:00pm at my home.

At this time we now have a venue. The event will be held at 3500 S. Logan and is set to begin at 6:00pm with a potluck. Our committee is asking home groups and individual members to please contact either Teresa or Iris in order to commit to a type of dish. We hope this will help spread out the different types of food a potluck can have instead of being heavy in one area. We are also asking vegetarians to please bring a vegetarian dish.

We are planning for a speaker meeting at 7:30pm. I have asked Bill S., RD from Casper, WY to share his experience, strength and hope. Saturday Night Live meets at this location at 8:00pm. I have spoken with their home group and their meeting will go on as scheduled. Their GSR has willingly been the contact for the church and will continue to do so on our behalf.

Beginning at 9:00pm we are proposing a coffee house event. I have been in contact with The Abstract Coffee Catering Company. They offer a mobile coffee service that

Beginning at 9:00pm we are proposing a coffee house event. I have been in contact with The Abstract Coffee Catering Company. They offer a mobile coffee service that includes Espressos, Americanos, Lattes, Mochas, Hot Chocolate, Steamers and Chai. They charge a flat rate for their services. With a figure of 100-150 participants their cost is \$375.00 for about two and a half hours of service. They will serve unlimited amounts for that time frame. We would like to sell tickets for coffee during this time frame for \$2.00 per 16oz. Beverage of choice. We have received many commitments from our local fellowships professional musicians. All people have agreed to donate their time for this event. We would like to suggest a \$5.00 donation for entrance into the coffee house.

I am submitting a budget for \$450.00 for this event. The breakdown is attached. I would like to ask the region to use the coffee supplies and any paper products left over from CRCNA XV for the potluck and meeting portion of this event.

I have brought 150 flyers for this event and would ask all RCM's to please bring them back to your areas and get them out ASAP. This event is happening in just over 30 days from now and it is our hope to have a regional event with as many participants as possible in order to foster continued unity.

The hotel that is being recommended to participants for the RMF is the Courtyard By Marriott. The rate is \$54.00 per night. If anyone wishes to stay there they can be reached at 1-800-321-2211.
